Rule 5.1 Scheduling a preliminary hearing	no later than 10 days after initial appearance if def in custody	14 days
	no later than 20 days after initial appearance if def not in custody	21 days
Rule 7 Motion for bill of particulars	within 10 days after arraignment	14 days
Rule 12.1 Notice of alibi witness disclosure of victim information	def must answer gov't req within 10 days of the request	14 days
	gov't must disclose within 10 days after def serves notice of alibi defense but no later than 10 days before trial	14 days
Rule 12.3 Notice of Public Authority Defense	gov't must respond within 10 days after def serves notice but no later than 20 days before trial	14 days 21 days
Rule 29 Motion for Judgment of Acquittal	motion made within 7 days of guilty verdict or jury discharge	10 days
Rule 33 New Trial	motion on other grounds to be filed within 7 days of verdict	14 days
Rule 34 Arresting Judgment	motion to be filed within 7	14 days

Rule 41 Search and Seizure	warrant to be executed within 10 days of issuance	14 days

Rule 47 Motions and Affidavits	motion must be served and filed 5 days before a hearing	7 days
Rule 58 Petty Offenses and Misdemeanors	interlocutory appeal to be filed within 10 days of entry of order	14 days
	appeal from conviction to be filed within 10 days of entry	14 days
Rule 59 Matters before Magistrate Judge	non dispositive objections to be filed within 10 days of service	14 days
	dispositive objections to be filed within 10 days of service of the disposition or recommendation	14 days
