The aforesaid Fine/Bail Schedule and revisions thereto, shall be used in all instances and by all law enforcement agencies within the District of Utah wherein collateral forfeiture amounts are determined with reference to State Law or Regulation pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 13, the Assimilative Crimes Act.
