INFORMATION FOR TRAVELING JURORS TO ST. GEORGE, UTAH

You have been summoned to appear as a juror for the United States District Court for the District of Utah. We are the Federal Court and have jurisdiction over the entire state of Utah. For this trial, you are being summoned to appear in the Fifth District Courthouse in St. George, Utah.

For many of you the **one-way** distance between your residence and the courthouse will exceed 80 miles. If so, you may choose to arrive the day before you are to report. If you do, your meal and hotel costs will be reimbursed to you. The current government hotel rate is \$94.00. You must submit a receipt for your hotel to be reimbursed for lodging costs; if you stay with a friend or relative, or choose to drive back and forth, your daily travel reimbursement will be limited to \$55.00 for meals and incidentals. Your round trip mileage will also be reimbursed at the current federal government rate. Please make note of your mileage as you will need to report it upon arrival for jury service.

There are several hotels located within walking distance to the courthouse. Here is a link to local hotels. www.visitstgeorge.com/hotels/. Please be sure to mention you are on Federal Jury Duty and request the federal government rate when you make your reservation, that rate can oftentimes be lower than the going rate. Please pack accordingly, the typical trial last from two to five days.

We understand that the distance you are required to travel may be a hardship for some of you. If you will suffer a hardship due to transportation, travel or conflicts with the jury service date please contact the Jury Administrator as soon as possible so we can work with you.
