New CM/ECF Events for Deposit and Disbursement of Interpleader Funds

Beginning April 1, 2017, counsel must use the following new motion events in CM/ECF for registry deposits and disbursements in interpleader cases under 28 U.S.C. Section 1335:

Motion for Interpleader Deposit (28 U.S.C. Section 1335) Motion for Interpleader Disbursement (28 U.S.C. Section 1335)

Interpleaded funds cannot be received or released without an order from the court. These new events will facilitate the court's compliance with tax reporting requirements for interpleader funds deposited under 28 8 U.S.C. Section 1335.

The standard motion events for deposit and disbursement should be used in non-interpleader cases.

Motion for Interpleader Deposit (28 U.S.C. Section 1335)

Follow the motion filing process and prompts. During the process, filer will see this screen:



If **No**, then the filer may continue filing the motion.

If **Yes**, then the filer will be directed to file the motion as a <u>Motion for Deposit of Funds</u>.

NOTE: A motion to deposit <u>interpleader</u> funds should NOT be filed using the general "Motion for Deposit of Funds" event. The filer will be prompted to use the "Motion for Interpleader Deposit" event.

Motion for Interpleader Disbursement (28 U.S.C. Section 1335)

Follow the motion filing process and prompts.

NOTE: A motion for disbursement of <u>interpleader</u> funds should NOT be filed using the general "Motion for Disbursement of Funds" event. The filer will be prompted to use the "Motion for Interpleader Disbursement" event.
