On March 31, 2020, the Court entered General Order 20-011, authorizing and implementing for up to 90 days certain emergency provisions under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), H.R. 748. Conditions in the District of Utah relating to the COVID-19 emergency have only worsened significantly since the Court invoked the emergency measures authorized by the CARES Act.

For the reasons articulated in General Order 20-011, and further supported by the COVID-19 related findings made by the Court in General Order 20-017 (entered June 15, 2020), exercising my authority as Chief Judge, I find that the emergency provisions under Section 15002(b) of the CARES Act remain necessary and appropriate in the District of Utah. I renew the findings made in General Order 20-011, and extend the authorizations made therein for 90 days unless earlier terminated or modified by further order of the Court.
