Dear Prospective Grand Juror:

You are being summoned as a potential Grand Juror in the United States District Court. If appointed, you will be reporting to the Courthouse two or three days a month for the next **eighteen (18) months**.

Prior to coming, please review the Notice to Appear, *Handbook for Federal Grand Jurors*, as well as the jury information page. They contain information about Grand Jury Service as well as instruction on travel, parking, jury duty payment, and other matters of interest to you, including the responsibilities of your employer. The Federal Court is closely monitoring conditions regarding the COVID-19 pandemic and is mindful of concerns you may have about your safety when appearing as a Grand Juror. The health and safety of visitors to the Courthouse are of extreme importance to us. To prevent the risk of infection, we have implemented aggressive policies and are taking extra precautions that include requiring face masks; frequently sanitizing counter tops, tables, and doorknobs; having hand sanitizer available; offering large spaces to accommodate social distancing.

Because there is a possibility that the time and date may be changed, the Court has a dial-up message system to provide jurors with up to date information, you will need your participant number when you call. The message line number is 801-524-6940. **If you neglect to call and you appear but the time and/or date have changed, the court cannot reimburse you for mileage or other costs. Thus, it is very important that you call prior to leaving your residence.**

You will be reporting to the Jury Assembly Room on the first floor of the Courthouse and will be given an orientation regarding Federal Grand Jury service. You will then be taken to the courtroom for the selection of the Grand Jury. The Jury Assembly room and courtroom are large and will permit social distancing, plexiglass has also been installed in the courtroom. The courtroom and the Jury Assembly Room will be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized prior to your arrival, and each evening thereafter.

Once in the courtroom you will meet with the Judge who, with the assistance of the U.S. Attorney's Office, will select 23 individuals as well as 10 alternates to serve as Grand Jurors. Those who are selected should plan on spending the entire day at the courthouse, when the work of the Grand Jury will commence. Thereafter, the selected Grand Jurors will spend an average of two days per month at the courthouse, for a term of eighteen months.

To prepare yourself for the questions at the Grand Jury Impanelment, we have listed a few things that you will want to consider before appearing:

- Federal Grand Jury sessions are typically held on **Wednesdays** from 8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. You would meet 2-3 times per month, one day every other week; consistent attendance is required although an occasional excused absence is allowed.
- While you will be paid \$50.00 a day for attendance, as well as be reimbursed for parking, mileage, and subsistence where applicable, this may not duplicate your normal wages. **Please go to your employer and find out what their jury duty policy is regarding payment. Do this before you appear in court, so you will know if there will be an undue financial hardship for you in serving on a Grand Jury.** Many employers will pay your normal wage for a limited number of days of jury service. You should be aware of all benefits or restrictions.
- If you care for an ill or elderly person or children under the age of ten daily and your absence would affect their health or safety, please be sure to notify the Judge and the attorneys during the impanelment hearing so that they can take that into consideration.
- If you anticipate a major lifestyle change in the next 18 months which would impede your Grand Jury service such as; returning to school, moving out of state, a change in employment or a change in your family situation, be prepared to notify the Judge and attorneys during the selection process.
