Comes now the United States of America, by and through its Attorney of Record, Lynda R. Krause, and respectfully Moves this Court to adopt the proposed Revised Collateral Forfeiture Schedule, attached hereto as Exhibit A, to wit: Bureau of Land Management (“BLM”) Revised Collateral Forfeiture Schedule (“CFS”). This Motion is based on the need to revise the existing BLM CFS, which was last updated in 2011. The proposed revised CFS includes some additional charges, based upon locally adopted supplemental rules, and some slight increases and decreases in collateral forfeiture amounts. (All additions and changes are highlighted in red.) The proposed changes in collateral forfeiture amounts are for violations assimilated under 43 CFR 8341.1(d) which were taken directly from the State of Utah Uniform Fine/Bail Forfeiture Schedule dated May 2018 prepared by the Administrative Office of the Courts and available at: [http://www.utcourts.gov/resources/rules/ucja/append/c\\_fineba/FineBail\\_Schedule.pdf](http://www.utcourts.gov/resources/rules/ucja/append/c_fineba/FineBail_Schedule.pdf).

Where forfeiture amounts were not listed in the State of Utah Schedule, every effort was made to keep the proposed forfeiture amount consistent with similar violations listed in the current BLM CFS or propose a Mandatory Court Appearance (“MA”).

The aforesaid Fine/Bail Schedule and revisions thereto, shall be used in all instances and by all law enforcement agencies within the District of Utah wherein collateral forfeiture amounts are determined with reference to State Law or Regulation pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 13, the Assimilative Crimes Act.


